**The APCSM plans to remain open by appointment for adoption and surrender. We have found scheduling adoption appointments has several benefits including:**

- Reduced stress for our adoptable animals as the decreased number of visitors walking through adoptions has increased the quality of life for our animals, especially our population of harder to place animals.
- Better matchmaking as we have been able to make thoughtful matches for animals by evaluating applications and speaking with potential adopters in advance about their lifestyle and what they are hoping for in a future pet alongside an animal's medical and behavioral needs.

- Once we have received an adoption counselor will reach out within 24-48 hrs to discuss the next steps.

# Adoption Fees:

## Dogs:

1 yr and under - \$600

Over 1 yr - \$425-\$525

Seniors (8 yrs and over)- \$350

### *Adoption fee covers the following expenses:*

- DHLPP Vaccine
- Bordetella Vaccine
- Rabies Vaccine
- Heartworm Test (plus one month's preventative)
- Deworming
- Spay/Neuter Surgery
- Transportation (plus quarantine fees, if applicable)
- Flea-Tick Prevention
- ID Tag
- Microchip ID (plus lifetime registration)
- Martingale Collar (plus 6ft leash)

**\*Some dogs may have higher adoption fees to include additional medical costs or training needed.**

## Cats:

Young cats (1 yr and younger) - \$375 Pair kittens \$560

Adult cats (over 1yr - 9 yrs) - \$250 Bonded pair\$375

Senior cats (10 yrs and up) - \$150

### *Adoption fee covers the following expenses:*

- FVRCP Vaccine
- Rabies Vaccine
- Feline Leukemia Test (< 6 months)
- FeLV/FIV Test (> 6 months)
- Deworming
- Spay/Neuter Surgery
- Flea Prevention
- Collar, ID Tag
- Microchip ID (plus lifetime registration)

## Smalls:

**Rabbits:** \$100 (adoption fee includes spay/neuter)

**Ferrets:** \$50 (adoption fee includes rabies vaccine)

**Guinea Pigs:** \$40 (adoption fee) pair \$50

**Hamsters:** \$20 (adoption fee)

**Other Pets:** *Please ask staff* (adoption fees may vary)

**Birds:** *Please ask staff* (adoption fees vary)

**\*Some animals may have higher adoption fees which include additional veterinary services.**
